What started out as exploring Diversity training and Human rights integration in Policing jurisdictions in the UK, USA and Middle East has resulted in a range of unexpected applications of diversity of thought and skills to the understanding and investigation of traditional practices such as Witchcraft, Female Genital Mutilation, Child Affection Behaviors and Forced Marriage to name a few. What do these mean within a diverse and multicultural Australia. The journey has begun for this work to now influence National Guidelines for Diversity training in Policing.
